



 - **Bills** are proposed statutes that have not yet passed through the legislative process
 - Statutes (acts) are written laws passed by the legislature that deal with a specific subject
 - Regulations are subordinate legislation that provide additional details about an act
- Case law
 - Written decisions from judges in the courts across Canada. It is also knowns as judge-made law or common law





- What is legislation?
 - **Bills** are proposed statutes that have not yet passed through the legislative process
 - Statutes (acts) are written laws passed by the legislature that deal with a specific subject
 - Regulations are subordinate legislation that provide additional details about an act



- How does legislation become law?
 - Draft legislation is prepared and introduced into the legislature as a bill:
 - To introduce new legislation
 - To change, amend, or repeal existing legislation
 - Bills must pass the "legislative process" to become law



- To become law, a bill must pass the "legislative process"
- First Reading: Bill introduced
- Second Reading: Debate occurs
- Committee Stage: Bill examined and researched
- Third Reading: Bill is put to a final vote
- Royal Assent: Royal assent is granted
- Coming In Force: Assent, Date, Proclamation









CHAPTER A-4.1

An Act respecting the Administration of Estates

NOTE: This Act was Schedule B of *The Queen's Bench Revision Act*, being chapter Q-1.1 of the *Statutes of Saskatchewan*, 1998. That Act was assented to on June 11, 1998. (See Chapter Q-1.1, s.7)

PART I Preliminary Matters

Short title

1 This Act may be cited as The Administration of Estates Act.

Interpretation

2 In this Act:

"action" means:

- (a) a civil proceeding commenced by statement of claim or in any other manner authorized or required by *The Queen's Bench Act, 1998* or the rules of court; or
- (b) any other original proceeding between a plaintiff and a defendant; ("action")

"court" means Her Majesty's Court of Queen's Bench for Saskatchewan; ("Cour")

"judge" means a judge of the court, and includes a supernumerary judge; ("juge")

"judicial centre" means a judicial centre continued or established pursuant to section 21 of The Queen's Bench Act, 1998; («centre judiciaire»)

"letters of administration" means all letters of administration of the property of a deceased person, with or without the will annexed and whether granted for general, special or limited purposes; ("lettres d'administration")

"local registrar" means a local registrar of the court appointed pursuant to section 3 of *The Court Officials Act, 2012*, and includes a deputy local registrar appointed pursuant to that section; (« registraire local »)

"matter" means every proceeding in the court that is not an action; ("affaire")

"minister" means the member of the Executive Council to whom for the time being the administration of this Act is assigned; ("ministre")

"public guardian and trustee" means the corporation sole of the Public Guardian and Trustee of Saskatchewan continued pursuant to section 3 of *The*

could not stand because the information did not allege any offence for which they could be convicted. The bylaw does not define what is meant by the term animal husbandry nor uses the term. They were not breeding, raising or caring for farm animals but merely kept a sheep, not unlike a large dog, in their back yard as a pet for their children. The city did not charge them with a nuisance type of offence, for a breach of public health regulations nor a breach of the animal control bylaw. It charged them with a zoning violation. Many activities conducted by veterinarians in the city or at the university would violate the bylaw. The role of the court is to interpret a bylaw in a purposive manner, not to make law by rewriting it. No evidence was adduced at trial as to what kinds of animals are considered by the community to be acceptable as pets in the city. (ii) Even if the information were amended to delete reference to animal husbandry, it was still unclear whether keeping one small sheep was an offence under the Act and the bylaw. (iii)It was clear they were not conducting any enterprise. Some findings of material facts by the bylaw court justice were not supported by the evidence.
